Treasurer's Report:

Kathy reported that a deposit of 72.00 was made of dues received. Checks were written as payments to Dianne B. for 4H supplies and to Kathy H. for kitchen supplies. The account balance is 5,333.31. Motion was made by Nancy to accept the treasurers report, motion second by Bonnie, motion passed.

Old Business:
