May Minutes

Opening and Introductions:

The meeting was opened at 6 p.m. by President Stephanie with Vice Pres. Bonny and Secretary Lorna in attendance. There were 24 members present, one of whom was a new member, Cindy Jones, who has been attending the Mystery Quilt classes.

Minutes: Motion was made by Diane to accept the April minutes as written, second by Sylvia and passed.

Treasurer's Report:

The donations collected at the Sew Day in the amount of \$56 were turned in and so were the dues from Cindy J. joining the Guild. Checks were written in the amount of \$75 for the Curlew Civic Club for rent of the hall, and \$7.79 for supplies. The balance is \$3,147.08

Old Business:

- This Saturday is the Open House. Set up will be on Friday night at 4 p.m. The Raffle quilt will be there and everyone is encouraged to bring boutique items for sale. There will be a sign-up sheet for the 2017 beginner classes. Nancy will be providing lunch makings for the people working the event. Anyone wanting to sew for demonstration is welcome to set up their machine.
- Kathryn presented a Ferry County Fair sign-up sheet for volunteers.
- Stephanie reported that the mystery quilt class wrapped up and was wonderful.

New Business:

- Christmas in July will be on the 18th of the month at Sara and Janet's home beginning at 6 p.m. It will be an outside potluck. Janet and Diane will provide turkey and ham and will be reimbursed for their expense. Discussion was held about the gift exchange and a motion was made by Diane that everyone bring 1 yard of Christmas fabric, motion seconded by Sylvia and motion carried. After the exchange everyone is to take the yard of fabric and make something to be a gift at the December Christmas party exchange.
- Stephanie passed out the pattern for the May Block of the Month "Serendipity Stars". She also passed out a second April block, "Pinwheel" for those who wanted an option. The patterns will be put on the website.
- Stephanie asked the members if they want to start another year of Block of the Month in August. There was a lot of interest so she asked for a volunteer to begin the next series of blocks. Cindy W. volunteered.
- Kathryn discussed the Beginner Quilt Classes and said she has teachers signed up and is looking for a teacher to give a basics class to begin the season. Each class will teach a new technique and she hopes to have samples at the fair of the projects that will be taught. She is planning to have flyers for the Open House and the Fair.
- Stephanie discussed bringing in an outside teacher for a program. She got information from Debra McKraken who is willing to come do a 2-day class on the 3D Labyrinth Walk which is an 84"x84" quilt. Debra would order the patterns for each which would be \$5-\$10. Debra would charge \$300 a day and \$125-160 for travel expenses. This would be a Fall class. Discussion was held about charges to members and non-members who sign up after all guild members have a chance to sign up. Janet made a motion that the guild pay for the room rent and expenses. Students pay for the patterns and the teacher's cost, motion was seconded by Mary and passed. Nancy will find out what weekends are available in Oct-Dec for the class. Anyone interested needs to bring a \$10 deposit to the next meeting.

Committee Reports:

- Raffle Quilt – Rae said the quilt will be at the Open House and she has tickets to be checked out by members. Rachel printed the tickets and Cindy cut and stapled them. Diane will check out the possibility of hanging the quilt on display at the Outfitters and see if Arwen is willing to sell tickets.
- Membership – Phyllis gave our new member Cindy J. the packet of information.
- Program – Cindy reported that the next Sew Day is May 28th at the Carousel Bldg. The June meeting program will be GADGETS. She asked that members bring gadgets that they use to show. The Shop Hop dates are June 25th for the Canadian trip and June 28th for the American trip. On June 21st the Row by Row begins and most of the shops on the lists are participating. Cindy explained the Row by Row and Stephanie suggested that everyone go on line to get more information. Lunch is optional.

Block of the Month: Janet was the winner this month.

- Cindy W. shared a Lighthouse panel quilt of valor and one of 14 bird seed bags she made at Lutherhaven.

- Bobbie M. showed her mystery quilt done in black, white, gray and blues for her grandson.
- Diane brought a little zipper purse that she made completely in a hoop, including the zipper, at a Bernina embroidery class.
