**Opening and Introductions:**

The meeting was opened at 6 p.m. by President Stephanie with Treasurer Joyce B. and Secretary Lorna. There were 24 members and 2 guests present.

**Treasurer's Report:**

Joyce B. reported that checks were written in the amounts of \$20.66 to Kathy H. for guild kitchen supplies and \$22.00 to Janet S. for the ham for Christmas in July. A deposit of \$30 for raffle tickets was made and the balance is \$3,325.26.

- Dianne B. reported that the Washington State Quilters have sent ribbons for 2016 and the ribbons for 2015 which will be awarded at the Fair. The 2015 rules were that the quilt had to be entirely made by the person. The 2016 award rules have changed and the quilt can be pieced by one person and quilted by another, the owner gets the ribbon. This was questioned and it was decided to leave it up to the judge.

***Block of the Month:*** The Block of the Month picture was taken and the winner drawn was Leslie T. Stephanie showed a magazine picture of an idea of how to arrange the BOM blocks as an idea for a layout. Stephanie will be helping at the October sew day to arrange quilt tops out of the blocks. Diane thanked Stephanie and Rae for all their work on the Block of the Month.

***Help Me:*** Stephanie brought a “Nickel Quilt” book to find the person that she had offered it to.

### ***Show and Tell:***

- Sarah B. showed a sampling of fabric that she is using oil paint sticks for rubbings for the labyrinth quilt class.
- Cathy K. brought purchases that she picked up at shows. They included a bag, scarfs with jewelry and “Around the Corner” with a boat scene.
- Kathryn B. showed a quilted bag that she made out of greens, pinks and tan.
- Nancy brought her sister, Maureen, apron with matching pot holders and tea towels with a Paris theme.
- Phyllis shared two table runners that were made with border prints. The first with a poinsettia print and the second with a blueberry print.
- Dianne B. showed her Judy Neymire quilt done in black, purple, turquoise and greens called “Moon Glow”.

- Rae brought a “Hobo” bag in black with multi-color quilting thread that gave an iridescent effect. Second, she showed a zipper bag pattern made of blue & white floral from a fat quarter and with 3 small bags. Third, she showed her Block of the Month quilt top in greens.

## *Scraps of Wisdom*

I haven't felt much like quilting this month, or anything else for that matter. My hip is hurting enough now to make me think twice before I move it. I am scheduled for a new one on Sept 26<sup>th</sup> and it can't come soon enough for me. I hate being slowed down and not able to do the things I normally do at the pace I am used to. Maybe the Lord is giving me a lesson in patience.

One of the things that I decided I could get done is working on my scrap basket. I have this collapsible canvas laundry basket that Tina gave me a number of years ago and I have used it to throw scraps into. Anything smaller than a fat quarter, ends of binding and odd shapes from Niemeyer projects. It has grown over the years to about thirty pounds of bits and pieces of fabric. I thought I could sit and iron it out and cut it into 3 inch squares, 2 ½ in squares and a few five inch squares. (During my fit of cleaning the other day I found a little box filled with 5 inch squares. There are probably enough to make a quilt.) During this project Leslie came looking for some specific colors and I encouraged her to take all she wanted. She barely made a dent.

So now, I probably have about 3000 three-inch squares. I was wondering what to do with them. Karlene and I stopped by the Colville Quilt Show last Friday and there on the wall above the featured quilter was my three inch square quilt set in diagonals of light and dark. The lights had a fine little star set at intervals in the blocks. Now all I have to do is figure out how to do it. I probably better get out some graph paper before I start and get a real plan in place. Maybe it will be something to do while recovering from the new hip.

I do have another project I'm working on. I dropped by Needlyn Time late one afternoon hoping to look at the color wall and get some ideas for the Labyrinth quilt class coming up in November. As soon as I walked in the door there was a runner pattern which used border fabrics and 60 triangles which caught my eye. A few steps farther and a new line of purple flowers on black caught my eye. There was 7/8 yard of the border fabric left. Well you know how that turned out. It's quick and easy. The next one is going to be in Red Poppies
