Opening:

The meeting was opened at 6pm by President Bonny with board members Dianne, Georgia, Lorna and Rachel present. There were 22 guild members in attendance.

Minutes:

Minutes of the March meeting were approved with no changes.

Treasurer's Report:

- Georgia reported that checks were written for the following:
- \$75.00 to Curlew Civics Hall for May Sew-In
- \$10.80 to Dianne B. for mailing newsletter
- Deposits were made in the amounts of:
- \$110.00 for ticket sales to the Raffle quilt
- \$24.00 for dues from two new members
- The ending balance is \$2,691.98.

Old Business:

- Stephanie talked about the quilting class for curved piecing and said that 5 people attended and a show n tell was held for those who brought their work from the class which included Phyllis, Dianne B., Sarah, Georgia and Stephanie.
- Katie B. showed the bag which will be taught at the quilt class on May 6th and the supply list and sign up is at the Outfitters with another sample of the bag.
- The next Sew-Day is April 22nd at the Curlew Old fire hall from 9am to 3pm.
- Bobbie May handed out quilt items that were displayed at the Curlew Library
- Nancy asked if anyone had her block of the month of the floating star pattern, there are still some not handed in.
- Members handed in Block of the Month squares to Rachel and Katie handed out a pattern called 'Double Nine Patch' and along with fabric for the darkest squares on the pattern and asked that the remaining fabrics used be in warm earth tones.
- Rachel spoke to the success of the Lutherhaven Retreat and that she is taking names for next year's retreat with \$50 deposits. The dates will be April 11th – 15th, with April 10th for those that like to go on Tuesday. She told how Jean from Deer Park brought fabric and notions for sale and mentioned that it was voted on that our Members who have stores may bring items for sale.
- Kathy has tickets for the Raffle Quilt so members should check with her to get them.

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- Nancy and Karlene will be giving the class for the Girlie Bag on June 24th. Nancy took a list of those interested in the pattern, zippers and foam core fusible.
- Rachel said that the discussion about the Tri-County Economic Development office Quilt Display will be next month.

New Business:

- Dianne discussed the cost of printing and mailing out the newsletter to those who want to receive it in the mail. It was decided that whoever wants the mailing that they pay Dianne for the printing cost as well as postage. Please see Dianne concerning this.
- Rachel will be making up a new mailing list and getting it out and asks that everyone looks at it to be sure all the information is correct.
- The regular meeting will be on May 8th next month due to the availability of the Carousel Building.
- Discussion was held concerning starting a new BOM program. Stephanie offered to organize a Row Quilt and explained what this type of quilt was. She will bring samples and the new BOM will begin in September.

Program Committee:

Stephanie said that Sally will bring samples and supply lists next meeting for a Strippy Scrappy Table Runner for a project at the May 20th Sew-Day in Curlew.

- Sarah wanted to know about dropping her feed dogs when using a walking foot as she was getting bunching on the back of her work. It was suggested she leave the feed dogs up and use more pinning.
- Bonny gave Sarah a gift of a tomato pin cushion and new pins donated by members.

Show 'N Tell:

- Sarah brought a quilt for her brother's wedding in blue, purple and greens with pillow shams in a 'Disappearing Nine Patch' pattern.
- Joan showed her Labyrinth quilt top in greens and yellows.
- Phyllis showed her scrappy quilt top in multi-color that will be tied when finished.
- Dianne showed her BOM sampler quilt of 20 blocks set on point in multi-colors.
- Mary showed her 'Old Crow' project that is made of wool.
- Janet showed a BOM from her Aunt Shirley.
- Rosalee showed a quilt that was made by her great granddaughter in modern fabrics.
- Katie showed her sample bag for the May quilt class program.
- Georgia shared a scarf that was hand dyed for her as a gift from Sarah.

Lutherhaven Show 'N Tell:

- Stephanie showed her set of tea towels, a rag quilt of hearts in blues, and 'Inchy Quilts' on sticks that are 1 square inch with raw edges.

- Joan showed her 2 mice and a trailer quilt which is an original with trees, stars and flying geese.
