

1 1/4 yards of white flannel for
 blocks
 1 1/4 yards of solid yellow flannel for
 blocks
 1 1/4 yards of pink print flannel for
 blocks
 1 3/4 yards of yellow print flannel No. 1
 for blocks
 1 5/8 yards of green print flannel No. 1
 for blocks
 1 yard of yellow print flannel No. 2 for
 blocks and binding
 1/3 yard of green print flannel No. 2 for
 blocks
 1/3 yard of blue print flannel for blocks

Fray-resistance liquid

Finished quilt: 36x42"
 Finished block: 6" square

Quantities specified for 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics. All measurements include a 1/4" seam allowance. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

CUT THE FABRICS

To make the best use of your fabrics, cut the pieces in the order that follows. Cut the squares for the blocks on the bias so the cut-and-stitched edges will fray after washing. To cut fabric on the bias, see Getting Started, which begins on page 8.

FROM SOLID WHITE, CUT:
 18—9 1/2" bias squares
 FROM SOLID GREEN, CUT:
 13—9 1/2" bias squares
 FROM SOLID YELLOW, CUT:
 11—9 1/2" bias squares
 FROM PINK PRINT, CUT:
 9—9 1/2" bias squares

FROM YELLOW PRINT NO. 1, CUT:
 18—9 1/2" bias squares
 FROM GREEN PRINT NO. 1, CUT:
 15—9 1/2" bias squares
 FROM YELLOW PRINT NO. 2, CUT:
 60—2" bias squares
 1—15" square, cutting it into enough 1 1/4" bias strips to total 180" in length for binding (For specific instructions on cutting bias strips, see Getting Started.)
 FROM GREEN PRINT NO. 2, CUT:
 60—2" bias squares
 FROM BLUE PRINT, CUT:
 48—2" bias squares

ASSEMBLE THE FLOWER BLOCKS

1. Referring to Diagram 1, with wrong sides together layer a solid 9 1/2" square with a print 9 1/2" square.

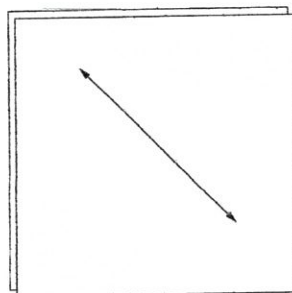

2. Referring to Diagram 2, fold the square's layered four corners to the center of the inner solid side. Press to hold the layered flaps in place. The folded square should measure about 6 1/2".

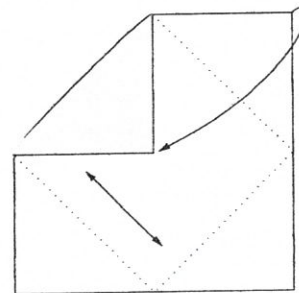

3. Select four matching print 2" squares. Referring to Diagram 3, place the squares right side up on the folded flaps of the pressed square, each one 1/4" from the raw edges. Pin in place.

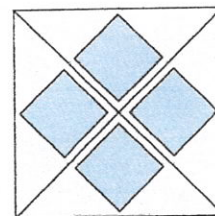

4. Referring to Diagram 4, stitch in a flower design through the square's layers to make a flower block. The flower block should still measure about 6 1/2" square.

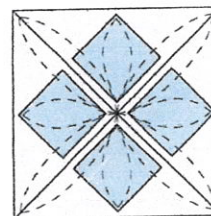

5. Repeat steps 1 through 4 to make a total of 42 flower blocks.
